Eligibility

There shall be no restriction of any applicant by reason of race, age, color, sex or national origin. The only limitations are following:

- Applicants must be permanent Illinois residents.
- Applicants must be graduating from the Hillsboro High School in the 2023-2024 school year.
- Scholarships are to be utilized at institutions of higher learning.
- Students must be enrolled as a full-time student in college during the 2024-2025 school year (excluding summer session). Students may not take a gap year.

*Please read the following very carefully. Failure to comply with the rules could result in disqualification.

Submit completed application packet with all documents specified to Mrs. Jenny Cearlock at the Hillsboro High School. The application packet must be turned no later than Monday, April 1st, 2024 by 3:00pm.
