



Empowering Children-Strengthening the Community



We serve five neighboring counties (Calhoun, Greene, Jersey, Macoupin, & Montgomery) to effectively provide safe, confidential, child-friendly interviews at our centers for children ages 3-18 affected by sexual or physical abuse to disclose their experiences. The child's interview is recorded so that the child only has to tell their story once, instead of multiple times, which may often retraumatize them.

We work with a multi-disciplinary team which includes individuals from child protective services, law enforcement, the criminal justice system, as well as mental and medical health services.

Courseling Services

Unified Child Advocacy Network offers FREE counseling services to all children served. We have contracts with local counseling agencies in order to provide counseling for up to 10 FREE sessions.

Counseling services can help children who have been effected by sexual or physical abuse and neglect, PTSD or other trauma-related conditions, grief, adjustment, social-emotional concerns, school problems, family matters (such as divorce or family separation), and various other issues that a child may be struggling with.

Counseling services can provide:

- *Someone outside of the situation to listen without judgement
- *Problem-solving and coping skills
- *Help to regain a sense of self-control
- *Support to handle day-to-day life
- *Education about abuse and how it can impact children
