Freshmen

Eastern Illinois University is test-optional. EIU will review applications based on college preparatory coursework, cumulative GPA, and self-reported SAT/ACT score (for those who report). Each application will require students to submit official high school transcripts for review.

Transfers

GPA of 2.0/4.0 with 24 or more college-level semester hours.
GPA of 2.0/4.0 at most recent school of attendance.
Students with less than above semester hours must also meet freshman criteria.

Honors College

The Honors College is available to new freshmen and transfer students. Honors freshman criteria for consideration is the upper 10% of the high school graduating class or a 3.5 cumulative GPA on a 4.0 scale and an ACT composite of 26 or higher, SAT of 1240 or higher. Students who are admitted via our test-optional admission with a 3.75 cumulative GPA will be considered for the Honors College. Transfer students with a minimum GPA of 3.50 will be considered for the Honors College.

UNIVERSITY PROFILE

Governors State University (GSU) offers majors and courses to students at all levels, from undergraduate through doctoral programs. GSU is also committed to serving community college graduates, transfer students, returning adults and commuting students as they pursue their education and career goals.

Students have several options for pursuing a bachelor’s degree at GSU. They can apply to begin their degree program as a freshman, transfer to GSU after completing coursework at another institution, continue their education at GSU after a delay, or enroll in the Dual Degree Program. The Dual Degree Program enables students enrolled full time in one of GSU’s 17 partner community colleges to complete their associate degree and enroll at GSU to complete their bachelor’s degree.

GSU offers 34 bachelor’s degree programs, with associated majors and minors, in liberal arts, sciences, education, business, and health sciences; 24 master’s degree and 5 doctoral degree programs.

Freshmen

This classification is for students who are currently attending high school or have graduated from high school but never attended college or have less than 24 semester hours from a regionally accredited institution. Special consideration will be applied when considering military veterans, international students, home school students, and GED earner applicants.

Requirements-Applicants must:

1. Have graduated or will graduate from high school with a minimum 2.75 GPA on a 4.0 scale.
2. Have earned a minimum ACT composite of 19 or minimum SAT Total score of 980
3. Must meet the minimum high school subject requirements of 4 years of English, 3 years of Math, 2 years of Lab Sciences, 2 years of Social Sciences, 2 years of Fine Arts or 2 years of a Foreign Language and 2 years of Elective Academic Units.
4. Applicants are required to submit official high school transcript(s) and official ACT or SAT score reports (if younger than 21 years old), or official GED. Final high school transcripts must be submitted after graduating or freshman applicants will be unable to begin courses.

*Freshman admits are required to participate in a unique learning community that requires full time attendance with coursework largely taking place between 8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. Monday-Friday. Freshmen are admitted for the fall and spring semesters.

Priority Application Deadline is November 1

Transfers

For academic year 2020-2021, a minimum of 24 semester or 36 quarter hours with a minimum GPA of 2.0 or an AA or AS degree from a regionally accredited institution and good standing at the last institution attended are required. Students not meeting the above criteria may petition for admission under certain circumstances. Specific majors have established selective criteria above the university minimum. Refer to the Governors State University Catalog for specific major criteria. GSU has rolling admission for most undergraduate programs. However, specific deadline dates for the fall, spring and summer semesters are published in the GSU Catalog.

Transfer

Transfer students must submit their application and all supporting documents including transcripts from all previously attended colleges and universities prior to all applicable deadlines.

Criteria for transfer admissions:

1. Students who have attempted up to and including 12 semester hours of credit will be evaluated as a freshman/first-year student.
2. Students who have attempted more than 12 semester hours, but have earned fewer than 24 semester hours must meet current freshman admissions requirements, be in good standing at the last college/university attended and have a GPA of at least 2.0 on 4.0 scale from all colleges and universities attended.
3. Students who have earned more than 24 credit hours must be in good standing at the last college/university attended and have a GPA of at least 2.0 on a 4.0 scale from all colleges/universities attended.

Freshmen Requirements

- Must graduate from high school before beginning classes, exceptions are made for students participating in the High School Concurrent Enrollment program and for those who have earned the GED, TASC, or HiSET
- Meet high school course pattern requirements: 4 years of English, 3 years of social science, 3 years of mathematics, 3 years of lab science, and 2 years of electives (foreign language, music, art, or vocational education)
- Will meet automatic admission if on track to complete the course pattern requirements and meet one of the following criteria:
 1. A cumulative high school GPA of 2.75/4.00
 2. A ranking in the top 10% of their graduating class
 3. At least a 23 ACT or 1140 SAT test score

Undergraduate students who do not meet one of the three criteria listed above will be reviewed for admission using a holistic review process. Certain academic programs have additional admission requirements (see list of selective programs below).

Students may apply beginning June 1. SIU Carbondale uses a rolling admissions process and will review application files once all required documents are received. Official high school transcripts should be submitted through an electronic transcript service or mail. ACT and SAT test scores are not required for general admission to the university.

Applicants who do not meet the minimum high school course requirements are required to correct high school deficiencies as determined by the Office of Admissions.

Deadline for Fall 2022 Freshman Admission

Applicants can apply beginning June 1 prior to their senior year with admission decisions beginning on September 7 and continuing on a rolling admission. SIUE does not require the standardized test (SAT and/or SAT) for admission; and the test score could only benefit a student (if for admission and/or course placement). Priority consideration for admission will be given to students whose applications and all supporting documents are postmarked by December 1. Applications (and supporting documents) postmarked after December 1 may be subject to additional review. Applications (and/or supporting documents) postmarked after May 1 may not be considered for admission.

SIUE accepts electronic transcripts submitted through various providers. In addition, electronic transcripts can also be sent to etranscripts@siue.edu directly from the institution. If a transcript is received through this account from a student, it will not be considered official.

Today, more than 4,000 students, known as Prairie Stars, learn, lead and shine, in one of four colleges: Business and Management, Education and Human Services, Liberal Arts and Sciences, and Public Affairs and Administration. Students choose from 30 bachelor’s degree plans, 20 master’s programs and one doctoral degree. UIS is a diverse campus community that includes a mix of traditional freshman residential students and full- and part-time adult, graduate, online and transfer students. Nearly 30% of students are of color and nearly 10% are international. UIS is also home to the Capital Scholars Honors Program, a unique baccalaureate experience for select freshmen. Further, 86% of faculty hold the highest degree in their field. The average class is 13, and the student/faculty ratio is 13:1.

UIS’ beautiful and spacious 746-acre campus is in Illinois’ capital city, and offers big-city amenities and small-town charm. Approved in all 50 states to offer 52 fully online or blended undergraduate and graduate programs, UIS Online has been recognized by US News and World Report for eight straight years. UIS also has a presence in other Illinois locations including, UIS Peoria and the University Center of Lake County in Grayslake, Illinois. Home to the renowned Center for State Policy and Leadership and its initiatives including, Innovate Springfield, a university-led social innovation and business incubator, and the Illinois Innocence Project, research and engaging students in research is a priority. More than 1,100 students live on campus in residence halls, apartments and townhomes. UIS competes in NCAA Division II men’s baseball, basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, tennis, and track/field, and women’s basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, tennis, track/field, and volleyball. As ranked as a Best Value School by US News and World Report, merit scholarships range from \$1,000 to a full tuition and housing award.

Applicants who have college coursework but fewer than 30 hours must meet freshman admission requirements. UIS participates in the Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI), a statewide agreement that allows transfer of the completed Illinois General Education Core Curriculum between participating institutions.

Students will be admitted to WIU if they have earned a 2.75+ GPA (4.0 scale) or graduate in the top 10% of their high school class at an accredited Illinois public or private high school. Students who have earned a 2.0 - 2.74 GPA (4.0 scale) will be reviewed.

Transfer

Applicants who have earned 24 or more semester hours of college work will be considered for admission on the basis of college performance only. A cumulative 2.0 GPA for all hours attempted from all institutions is required. Students must be in good standing at the last college/university attended.

Applicants who have earned fewer than 24 semester hours must meet freshman admission standards, have at least a cumulative 2.0 GPA for all hours attempted from all post-secondary institutions, and be in good standing at the last college/university attended.

WIU offers a Transfer Admissions Guarantee (TAG) program that students can enroll in during their freshman year at a community college. This program will require students to meet transfer admissions requirements prior to enrolling at WIU, but allows students to connect early to information and services.

Honors College Eligibility

Entering freshmen must have a 3.75+ GPA or meet two of the following three criteria:

- 3.4 GPA
- SAT 1160+ or ACT 24+
- Top 15% of Graduating Class
